The Weehawken Free Public Library has been able to obtain access to two new databases for your research needs. The following databases can be accessed **FREE** with your Weehawken Library card from our website by clicking on the **JERSEY CLICKS** icon.

HeritageQuest

This genealogical database has access to government records, census data and auxiliary resources to help find information regarding your family history.

Peterson's Test and Career Center

This database allows users to search thousand of college and graduate school, identify scholarships, take practice tests, create resumes and explore careers.

How do I obtain a library card?

All you need is proof you live or work in Weehawken.

- Driver's license/ NJ State ID plus either a current lease, property tax bill or utility bill with Weehawken address
 - Letter or ID verifying Weehawken employment

Residents can apply in person or at http://www.bccls.org and click on Apply for a Card.

Children ages 6 months –14 years-old may get their own card with a parent /guardian signature.

Museum Pass Program

Looking for something to do? The Weehawken Library is circulating passes to some of the area's most popular museums and destinations. Free passes to Storm King Sculpture Park, The Frick Collection, The Guggenheim, the Children's Museum of Manhattan and The Newark Museum are available to Adult Weehawken residents with a valid Library Card. For further Information and to obtain a pass, stop by the Library's Second Floor Desk.

Passes to the American Museum of Natural History are available at a discounted price for Weehawken residents.

How do I request items?

- * If an item you want is not available here, you may request it from another BCCLS library by placing a hold online at http://www.bccls.org or by calling us with your library card number.
- * We will either call, text or email you when items are available for pick-up. Items will be held for 4 days.
- * Contact the 2nd Floor Reference Desk to request items from other NJ libraries beyond the BCCLS system.


 This e-service is offered via the BCCLS catalog. Libby is a fresh and easy way to borrow e-books, downloadable audios and e-magazines.

- * You must bring a valid BCCLS Library card to use the public computers for up to 2 hours. 30 minutes extensions can be requested at the desk at the discretion of the Library staff after 3:00 PM.

- * Once you log off all computer files are erased; make sure your documents are .emailed or saved on a flash drive before ending your session.
- * The ability to download files/software is limited.


