Looking for something to do? The Weehawken Library is circulating passes to some of the area's most popular museums and destinations. Free passes to Storm King Sculpture Park, The Frick Collection, The Guggenheim, the Children's Museum of Manhattan and The Newark Museum are available to Adult Weehawken residents with a valid Library Card. For further Information and to obtain a pass, stop by the Library's Second Floor Desk.

How do I use the computers & Internet?

How do I use the computers & Internet?

- * We offer free Wi-Fi password-protected access.
- You must bring a valid BCCLS Library card to use the public computers for up to 2 hours. 30 minutes extensions can be requested at the desk, and given at the discretion of the Library staff after 3:00 PM.
- * Computers have MS Office and Internet access.
- * Once you log off, all computer files are erased; make sure your documents are emailed or saved on a flash drive before ending your session.
- * The ability to download files/software is limited.

Library Services

How do I obtain a library card?

All you need is proof you live or work in Weehawken.

- Driver's license/ NJ State ID plus either a current lease, property tax bill or utility bill with Weehawken address
 - * Letter or ID verifying Weehawken employment

Residents can apply in person or at http://www.bccls.org and click on Apply for a Card.

Children ages 6 months –14 years-old may get their own card with a parent /guardian signature.

How do I request items?

- * If an item you want is not available here, you may request it from another BCCLS library by placing a hold online at http://www.bccls.org or by calling us with your library card number.
- * We will either call, text or email you when items are available for pick-up. Items will be held for 4 days.
- * Contact the 2nd Floor Reference Desk to request items from other NJ libraries beyond the BCCLS system.

E-Services

- Hoopla—Residents can use their library card to access over 500,000 items via the Hoopla catalog.
 E-books, e-comic, e-graphic novels, downloadable audios, vides and music are available. Visit http://hoopladigital.com to set up a free account.


